**My beloved parishioners,**

By the Grace of God and with the blessing of our spiritual father, His Eminence Metropolitan Apostolos of New Jersey, I have now completed the first six months of my ministry at Saint Thomas. These months have truly been filled with God's blessing, with a rich liturgical life, and with many events and activities. Through all of this, I have gradually had the opportunity to get to know you personally, and I consider it a great honor. Each one of you is precious and significant as an image of God. As a priest, I am called to be a father to the entire community and to love everyone without distinction, following the example of our Lord, who shows no partiality, as Saint Paul reminds us in Romans 2:11.

During these six months, we experienced two wonderful blessings that will remain important milestones in the history of our parish. The first was the reception of the holy icon and sacred Epitrachelion of Saint Iakovos of Evia, which filled our hearts with deep emotion. The second was the completion of the iconography of our church. Your sacrifices and hard work bore fruit, and a beautiful and original work has been entrusted to us, a precious legacy for future generations. Now every pilgrim and visitor, as well as we ourselves, are able to enjoy this spiritual joy and beauty.

And now, as fellow travelers in the spiritual journey of our holy Church, we are sailing through the sacred season of Great Lent with Holy Pascha as our destination. This period of the Triodion is like a garden filled with the colorful flowers of sacred hymns and prayerful services, strengthening us for our spiritual struggle. The Great Compline, the Presanctified Divine Liturgy, the Salutations to the Theotokos, the Holy Unction, the Saturdays of the Souls, and above all the Sunday Divine Liturgies offer us many opportunities for repentance and renewal. The effort of fasting may be small, yet the spiritual reward is great.

I thank you for your reverent participation in the services, and especially for your regular presence in church and the conscious involvement of your children. It is truly beautiful to see our children worshipping, receiving Holy Communion, attending Orthodox Faith Sunday School and Hellenic School, participating in GOYA and in the Hellenic Heritage Dance Group. These moments give hope and life to our parish.

I would also like to offer my heartfelt congratulations to the advisors and the dancers of HHDG who



represented our parish so beautifully at MDF, the annual festival of our Metropolis. More than a thousand children from across the Metropolis took part in this excellent event. With your help and support, I would like to set a goal for next year for Saint Thomas to have an even greater presence, with at least fifty children participating, so that as many of our young people as possible may experience this unique opportunity. At the same event, our parish choir, under the direction of our devoted Protopsaltis, Mr. Anastasios Fakinos, chanted the sacred hymns with devotion and excellence and received warm and commendable remarks from the judges.

Amid the many joys and blessings of life, there are also moments of sorrow. In recent days, we said farewell with deep sadness and emotion to our sister Zoe Kousoulis, a faithful member of our church whose life was closely connected to the life of our parish. We pray for her repose, as we do for all our brothers and sisters who have departed from this life and now rest in the embrace of Christ. In honoring their memory, we are establishing that each Saturday of the Souls, on the eve of Pentecost, we will offer memorial services and commemorate by name all our parishioners who have fallen asleep in the Lord from January 1st of the previous year until that Saturday of the Souls.

May you have a blessed remainder of Holy and Great Lent. May we be found worthy, by the grace of the Triune God, to venerate once again the sacred Passion and the holy Resurrection of our Lord.

**Αγαπημένοι μου ενορίτες!**

Με τη Χάρι του Θεού και την ευχή του Σεβασμιωτάτου Μητροπολίτη μας Νέας Ιερσέης, κυρίου Αποστόλου, συμπλήρωσα τους έξι πρώτους μήνες της διακονίας μου στην ενορία του Αγίου Θωμά. Ήταν πραγματικά έξι μήνες πλημμυρισμένοι με την ευλογία του Θεού, με πλούσια λατρευτική ζωή, με πολλές εκδηλώσεις και δραστηριότητες. Μέσα από αυτά έχω την ευκαιρία σιγά σιγά να σας γνωρίζω προσωπικά και αισθάνομαι ιδιαίτερη τιμή για αυτό. Είστε όλοι πολύτιμοι και σπουδαίοι ως εικόνες Θεού και εγώ ως ιερέας καλούμαι να είμαι πατέρας όλης της κοινότητας και να αγαπώ τους πάντες χωρίς διακρίσεις ακολουθώντας το αγαθό παράδειγμα του Θεού, που μας αγαπά δίχως προσωποληψία (Ρωμ. 2, 11).

Σε αυτούς τους έξι μήνες είχαμε δύο θαυμάσιες ευλογίες, που καταγράφηκαν ως σπουδαία ιστορικά γεγονότα για την ενορία μας. Το πρώτο ήταν η υποδοχή της εικόνας και του ιερού επιτραχηλίου του Οσίου Ιακώβου εν Ευβοία, που γέμισε τις καρδιές μας με συγκίνηση. Το δεύτερο η ολοκλήρωση της εικονογράφησης. Ο κόπος και οι θυσίες σας έπιασαν τόπο και παραδόθηκε ένα έργο όμορφο, πρωτότυπο, πολύτιμη παρακαταθήκη για τις επόμενες γενιές. Έτσι, κάθε προσκυνητής και επισκέπτης και βέβαια εμείς οι ίδιοι απολαμβάνουμε αυτή την πνευματική χαρά και ομορφιά.

Και τώρα, όλοι μαζί ταξιδιώτες στο νοερό πνευματικό καράβι της αγίας μας εκκλησίας πλέουμε στο πέλαγος της Αγίας και Μεγάλης Τεσσαρακοστής με λιμάνι προορισμού το Άγιο Πάσχα. Η περίοδος αυτή του Τριωδίου είναι ένας κήπος γεμάτος με πολύχρωμα άνθη τους ιερούς ύμνους και τις κατανυκτικές προσευχές, όπου οσφραινόμαστε οσμήν ευωδίας πνευματικής και παίρνουμε δύναμη για τον πνευματικό μας αγώνα. Μέγα Απόδειπνο, Προηγιασμένη Θεία Λειτουργία, Χαιρετισμοί της Θεοτόκου, Ιερό Ευχέλαιο, Ψυχοσάββατα και πάνω από όλα οι Κυριακάτικες Θείες Λειτουργίες. Μικρός ο κόπος της νηστείας, όμως μεγάλη η πνευματική ανταμοιβή με όλες αυτές τις πνευματικές ευκαιρίες.

Σας ευχαριστώ για τη συμμετοχή σας με ευλάβεια στη λατρεία και προ πάντων για τον τακτικό εκκλησιασμό και τη συνειδητή συμμετοχή των παιδιών σας. Είναι τόσο όμορφο να βλέπουμε τα παιδιά να λειτουργούνται και να κοινωνούν, να πηγαίνουν στο Κατηχητικό και το Ελληνικό Σχολείο, στη GOYA, στο χορευτικό.

Ήθελα να συγχαρώ μέσα από την καρδιά μου τους υπεύθυνους και τα παιδιά του HHGD που εκπροσώπησαν πολύ όμορφα την ενορία μας στο MDE, την ετήσια γιορτή της Μητρόπολής μας, μία εκδήλωση στην οποία συμμετείχαν περισσότερα από χίλια παιδιά από όλη τη Μητρόπολη και ήταν μία εξαιρετική διοργάνωση. Θέλω να θέσω ως στόχο, με τη δική σας βοήθεια και υποστήριξη, τον επόμενο χρόνο η ενορία του Αγίου Θωμά να έχει ακόμα μεγαλύτερη εκπροσώπηση με τουλάχιστον πενήντα παιδιά, ώστε να έχουν όσο περισσότερα παιδιά μπορούν αυτή την μοναδική ευκαιρία και εμπειρία. Στην ίδια διοργάνωση και η χορωδία της ενορίας μας υπό τη διεύθυνση του άξιου Πρωτοψάλτη μας Αναστασίου Φακίνου απέδωσε θαυμάσια εκκλησιαστικούς ύμνους αποσπώντας ιδιαίτερα θερμά και επαινετικά σχόλια από την κριτική επιτροπή.

Ανάμεσα στις πολλές χαρές και ευλογίες πάντα στη ζωή υπάρχουν και οι λύπες. Έτσι τις προηγούμενες ημέρες αποχαιρετήσαμε με βαθειά λύπη και συγκίνηση την αδελφή μας Ζωή Κουσουλή, πιστό μέλος της εκκλησίας μας, που η ζωή της ήταν άρρηκτα συνδεδεμένη με τη ζωή της ενορίας. Προσευχόμαστε για την ανάπαυσή της, όπως βέβαια και για όλους τους αδελφούς μας, που δυστυχώς έφυγαν από κοντά μας και αναπαύονται τώρα στην αγκαλιά του Χριστού μας. Τιμώντας τη μνήμη τους καθιερώνουμε από φέτος κάθε Ψυχοσάββατο, παραμονή της Πεντηκοστής, να τελούμε ιερά μνημόσυνα μνημονεύοντας όλα τα ονόματα των ενοριτών μας, που κοιμήθηκαν από την 1η Ιανουαρίου του προηγούμενου έτους έως το Ψυχοσάββατο.

Καλό υπόλοιπο της Αγίας και Μεγάλης Τεσσαρακοστής, είτε να αξιωθούμε με την Χάρι του Τρισαγίου Θεού να προσκυνήσουμε και φέτος τα σεπτά Πάθη και την Αγία Ανάσταση του Κυρίου μας.

### SAINT THOMAS PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE THE SAINT THOMAS MEDAL OF FAITH

**Dear Fellow Parishioners,**

As we approach the Paschal season our community is proud to have completed a nine year expansion and renovation of our Ekklesia, our house of worship. The term “Ekklesia” is an ancient Greek word meaning gathering. It is the primary place where the People of God gather to worship the Most Holy Trinity. Therefore, beautifying our Church is a paramount duty.

Since 2017, we did just that: We created the exonarthex (with the columns and the mosaic in the entrance. We added a dome in the middle of the Church, a belltower and a stone exterior. And lastly, we added prayerful iconography throughout the Church interior, following the theological guidance of our Orthodox faith. On April 19, as we celebrate the fest of Saint Thomas, we will proudly look at these accomplishments and give glory to God for guiding us to this joyful conclusion.

To celebrate the new beginnings of our community, we will institute this year the Saint Thomas Medal of Faith. The concept comes from the Gospel. It reminds us of the young apostle Thomas, who for one minute he asked for proof of the Risen Christ and the next minute he declared “my Lord and my God.” Thomas’ faith helped him overcome his questions. Isn’t this the story of every Christian? We often question our ability to achieve what seems unachievable, but our faith in God brings us to the desired end.

We chose as the first recipients of this auspicious medal our parishioners George and the late Zoe Kousoulis. Their faith and their dedication to the Church have been an example for us all. They are the embodiment of Christ’s declaration to Thomas: “Blessed are those who did not see and believed.” George and Zoe were faced with the tragic death of their beloved daughter Danielle and yet they kept their faith in Christ and their dedication to the Church. As we were planning this event, the Lord called Zoe to His House. She fell asleep in the Lord a few days before we unveiled the new iconography. Although she was not in the middle of the Church looking up to the Pantokrator whose Holy image she and George dedicated in memory of Danielle, we know that she was up on the top of the dome with Him looking down on us. May her memory be eternal.

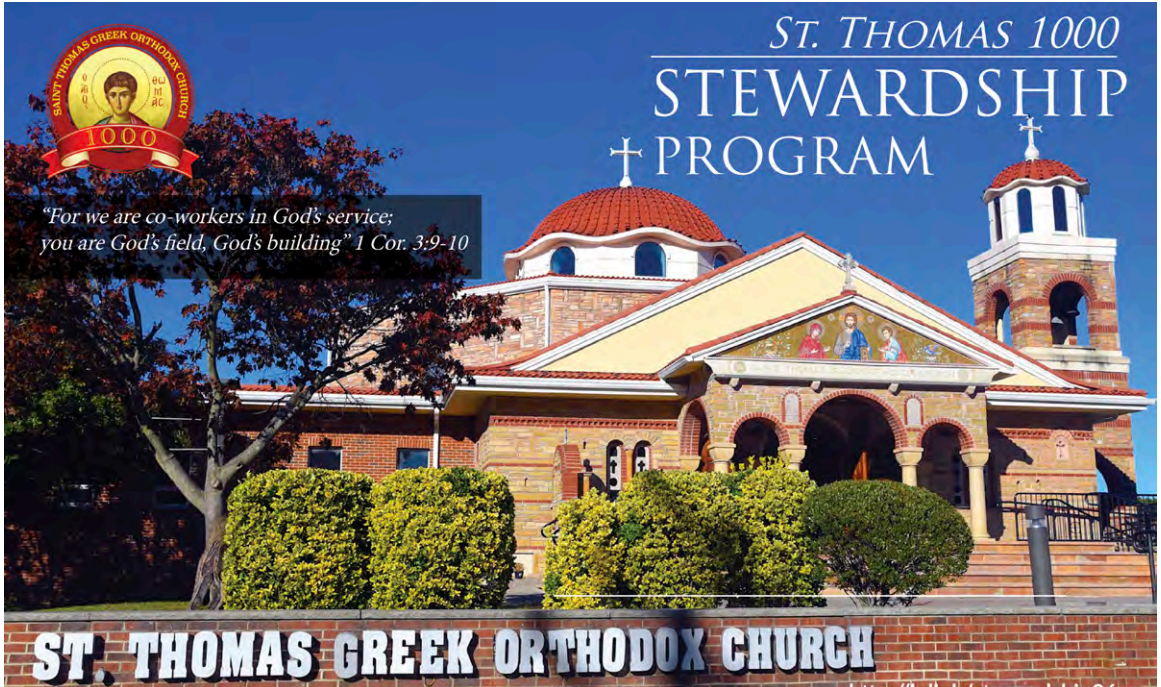
On the Sunday of Saint Thomas we will also celebrate another milestone in our parish: The ordination of our own Charles Sandilos to the Holy Diaconate. The ordination shows the spiritual maturity of our parish which did not only build one of the most beautiful byzantine churches in the United States, but it also produces stewards who serve Christ in every possible way, including through the ranks of the clergy.

On this upcoming Pascha, let us thank the Lord for the gifts he has given us and let us pray for the strength and faith of Saint Thomas to continue our mission to serve our community in South Jersey and through it to serve Christ.

Saint Thomas has been blessed with many good stewards who have been giving in order to proclaim the message of Christ. We all support our Church from the gifts that God has bestowed upon us. Some provide financial support, others contribute in kind from their talents, but most give both their talent and treasure. This is the true meaning of “Yours from Your Own,” our 2026 Stewardship Campaign. We all give from what God gave us. For that reason, we encourage you to continue being a steward of Saint Thomas or, if you are not a steward yet, to join this flock of Christ which has been growing and serving His Church.

All Orthodox Christians are united with Christ through the sacraments, or mysteries, of the Church and through our faithful offering of our entire selves to Jesus Christ. The Parish is a community of Orthodox Christians, an “Ekklesia” (which in Greek means “gathering”). We all gather together to worship. In order to keep

the Ekklesia alive we need material resources to meet the needs of the many ministries that the Church supports.

St, Thomas needs for everyone to increase the stewardship level so we can meet the ever-increasing expenses of keeping the doors of the Church open. Please keep in mind that monetary stewardship donations are kept in the strictest of confidence. We rely upon pledges to better plan our annual operating budget (the 2026 budget approved by the General Assembly for fair share is \$530,000).

## “For the Ages”: Saint Thomas Greek Orthodox Church Celebrates Completion of Sacred Iconography

After three years of prayerful anticipation and sacrificial devotion — and nearly a decade of vision and planning — the faithful of Saint Thomas Greek Orthodox Church gathered for a sacred and historic evening celebrating the completion of the interior iconography of their beloved church, a work truly “For the Ages.”

The celebration began with a solemn Paraklisis service to the parish’s Patron Saint, the Holy Apostle Thomas. The service was led, on behalf of His Eminence Metropolitan Apostolos of New Jersey, by the Very Rev. Archimandrite Christoforos Oikon-

omides, who conveyed the paternal blessings and heartfelt love of the Metropolitan. In his remarks, he emphasized that His Eminence played an integral role in the realization of the iconography project and that without his guidance, encouragement, and unwavering support, this sacred endeavor would not have been possible.

Clergy of the Delaware Valley joined in prayer, filling the church proper alongside Archons of the Ecumenical Patriarchate, officials of the Metropolis of New Jersey, Philoptochos members, Parish Council representatives, donors, neighboring parishioners, and many faithful who came to witness this milestone in the life of the community.

challenge of the COVID-19 pandemic, which temporarily slowed progress. Yet the vision endured.

## A Vision Born in 2017

In remarks delivered by Archon Anastasios Efstratiades, President of the Parish Council, the community was reminded that this journey began in 2017, on the 50th anniversary of the opening of the Church, when the faithful overwhelmingly resolved to complete the church and enhance its architectural integrity in accordance with Byzantine tradition.



During the consecutive presidencies of George Horiates, Stathis Karadonis, and Dimitri Rozanitis — under the guidance of then-Proistamenos Very Rev. Archimandrite Christoforos Oikonomides — the renovation plan was conceived and the first stage completed: the construction of the exonarthex, adorned with columns and a portico.

The entrance was beautified with a mosaic of Christ, flanked by the Panagia and Saint Thomas.

Plans for the Dome, Bell Tower, and exterior stonework were finalized in 2018. In 2019, Mr. Efstratiades assumed the presidency of the Parish Council and, with the support of Father Christoforos, building committee chair George Horiates, and the faithful, brought the construction phase to completion.

As soon as that work concluded, the parish turned its focus to iconography — only to face the unexpected

In 2023, under the presidency of George Horiates and the guidance of the new Proistamenos, the Very Rev. Archimandrite Avgoustinos Psomas, the iconography project resumed with renewed determination. With the blessing of His Eminence Metropolitan Apostolos, the parish engaged the world-renowned iconographer, Georgios Giariskanis of Thessaloniki.



## Theology in Color: The Sacred Work Unfolds

Mr. Giariskanis' reputation spans the globe, and his work at Saint Thomas reflects the theological order and prayerful tradition of the Orthodox Church.

The first phase brought to life the majestic Pantocrator in the Dome, surrounded by angels, prophets, and the righteous of the Old Testament — executed in strict accordance with Orthodox theological tradition. As Mr. Efstratiades reminded those gathered: “In the Orthodox Church, our architecture, our painting, our music — they are not art; they are prayer.”

The second phase included more than sixty saints depicted along the lower walls — perhaps one of the largest synaxes of saints in any Orthodox church in the United States.

The final phase completed scenes from the New Testament across the ceiling, restored original icons dating back decades, and culminated in a singular and unprecedented work: a large rear panel dedicated to the life of Saint Thomas.



Created through deep study of Scripture and Holy Tradition — much like the early iconographers — the panel depicts the baptism of a prince in India, Saint Thomas teaching the people of India, and his holy martyrdom. This original composition exists nowhere else and will indeed remain for the ages.

## A Witness of Faith and Memory

Particularly moving was the recognition of the first and largest benefactors of the iconography project — George and the late Zoe Kousoulis — who sponsored the Pantocrator in loving memory of their daughter, Danielle Kousoulis, who tragically lost her life in the September 11 attacks at the World Trade Center.

The community had previously renamed its cultural center in Danielle's memory.

As Archon George Horiates, Chairman of the Iconography Committee, spoke, he also addressed the family's recent sorrow: Zoe Kousoulis had fallen

asleep in the Lord just days prior, as she prepared to come to Church and chant in the choir. For their unending faith through unspeakable tragedy, George and Zoe were selected unanimously to be honored by the community with its first ever "Saint Thomas Medal of Faith" this coming April. With emotion and compassion, he offered condolences to her son, Peter, who was seated in the front pews, speaking of the heavenly reunion now shared by mother and daughter.

As the interior was revealed in its fullness, the Pantocrator gazed down from the Dome with compassion while many lifted their eyes heavenward in reverent awe of the iconography, the recent events and of divine providence.

**"Only the Name of the Holy God is Glorified"**

When Mr. Giariskanis was invited forward, the congregation responded with heartfelt applause. Trembling with emotion, gratitude, and holy awe, he expressed that he felt the blessings of the Apostle Thomas and the intercessions of Iakovos of Tsalikis, the patron saint of the Metropolis of New Jersey.

In humility he declared:

"The church is revealed. The ego of the artist has no place... Only the name of the Holy God is glorified."





## A Legacy for Future Generations



Protopresbyter Georgios Oikonomou concluded the evening with profound gratitude to His Eminence

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Metropolitan Apostolos for his vision, paternal care, and leadership. He thanked the faithful who labored tirelessly and sacrificially to bring the project to fruition.

“They sought what was best,” he said. “They did not choose painters, but true masters reflecting the dignity of the house of God — a house that future generations will enjoy.”

Indeed, what now adorns Saint Thomas Greek Orthodox Church is more than paint and plaster. It is theology proclaimed in color, prayer expressed in form, and faith preserved for generations yet to come.

A vision begun nearly a decade ago now stands complete — a sacred inheritance, a testament of unity, and a gift truly “For the Ages.”



## **Georgios Giariskanis' Address at the Official Presentation of the Completed Iconography of St. Thomas Greek Orthodox Church, Cherry Hill, NJ**

Your Eminence, Metropolitan Apostolos of New Jersey,

My beloved Father Georgios,

Reverend Fathers,

Dear and honorable President Archon Anastasios Efstratiades,

Esteemed members of the Parish Council,

Beloved members of the Greek Orthodox Church of Saint Thomas,

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ!

What unites us Greeks when we are far from our homeland is our love for our mother country and our shared faith in God our Father. This gives us strength, courage, hope, and a vision for life.

The great Nobel laureate, George Seferis, once said something that perfectly expresses who I am as a man of labor and dedication who has been close to the Church since birth: "I do not know if I would have been the same person had I not been born Greek and Orthodox." This is my personal confession, which I present to you today.

At this moment, my heart trembles with emotion, gratitude, and holy awe. I stand before you not merely to present a work of art, but to fulfill a vow, to offer an act of prayer, faith, and obedience to God's will.

This church was not painted only with colors and gold. It was painted with toil, tears, patience, and trials, and, above all, with the Grace of God and the protection of our Panagia, the most Holy Theotokos.

It was an achievement, a true feat. It was a difficult journey filled with obstacles and moments when one

could have easily given up. Yet we arrived safely at the harbor. Not because we were strong. But because we were not alone.

We always felt the blessing of the Apostle Thomas, guiding and sanctifying our hands as we adorned his holy temple. We felt the intercession of Saint Iakovos Tsalikis, the patron Saint of the Holy Metropolis of New Jersey, whose sacred icon we recently painted. Through him, we experienced the miracle of his coming among us.

God went before us.  
The Panagia held our hand.  
All of you walked beside us.

You strengthened our hands so that we could complete this masterpiece, which we now humbly place in your care.

First and foremost, I would like to express my deepest gratitude and respect to our Metropolitan, His Eminence Apostolos of New Jersey. Our relationship is not merely formal. It is fraternal and was born years ago in the blessed Monastery of Saint Anastasia in Thessaloniki. Your support, Your Eminence, your understanding, paternal love, corrections, and observations, have been an invaluable foundation for me and our community.

I would also like to thank Fr. Avgoustinos Psomas, the former priest of the community, for making the initial contact and inviting me to undertake the iconography of this holy temple.

Special thanks go to Fr. Georgios Oikonomou, the Proistamenos of this parish, a man of empathy and love for all. It is no coincidence that he is my fellow Thessalonian. He embodies the virtues of a Greek who holds Christ and Greece in his heart and faithfully fulfills his sacred duty. His cooperation with us was fraternal and blessed, and I will always remember it.

I thank the president of the community, Archon Anastasios Efstratiades, with deep appreciation. He is a man with a capital "M." He stood by our side from the very beginning until the completion of this

sacred task. I would also like to thank the chairman of the iconography committee, Archon George Horiates, who was tireless and ever-present, a truly invaluable collaborator. Their kindness, integrity, and dedication will remain unforgettable to us. From the first day of our work together, you embraced us with love, respect, and trust. Your character and ecclesiastical ethos set an example for us.

The art we serve is not merely a profession. It is tradition. It is responsibility. It is a witness. It is a sacred mystery.

We remain faithful to the Byzantine tradition by selecting the highest quality materials because these works belong not only to today, but also to tomorrow and the generations yet to come. We are perfectionists, not out of pride, but out of reverence.

By worldly standards, the cost of our work may not appear "competitive." However, we do not produce mass-produced religious items. We don't create commercial images. We create sacred works that are guaranteed to be of enduring quality and faithfulness.

This church presented us with a unique artistic challenge. We were tasked with uniting the existing Dodekaorton (the Twelve Feasts) icons, painted by another artist, with our new work. We had to seamlessly merge two different techniques so that the transition would be undetectable to the eye. We preserved what existed with respect, intervened where necessary, renewed backgrounds, added new gilding and Byzantine inscriptions, and consciously altered elements of our personal style in certain sections. All to serve the harmony of the whole. In the church, after all, the iconographer is not what is displayed. The church is revealed.

The ego of the artist has no place here.  
Only the name of the Holy God is glorified.

For this project, we used a rare, time-tested material: chemical gold, which is especially suited to the United States' climate and ensures long-term preservation and durability. Future generations will understand the value of this choice. They will see and admire the sacred inheritance you have left behind.

From the bottom of my heart, I thank all those who generously contributed, whether they were great or small benefactors, because without your sacrifices, this work could not have been completed.

Special thanks to the St. Irene Philoptochos Society; the melodious chanter, Mr. Tasos Fakinos; our beloved secretary, Maria Krontiris; and Mr. Louis Centeno, the church's tireless helper, who stood by us daily with practical assistance, kind words, and acts of love.

I also thank my collaborators and assistants, both those who traveled with me and those who worked from Greece. Without companionship, art becomes isolation. Trust, unity, and faithful execution brought about this harmonious result.

Please allow me to speak as a husband and father as well. I would like to thank my wife, Stella, who has been my companion through the easy days and the difficult ones. I thank my sister, Eleni, and her husband, Kostas. I Thank my children, Petros, Fotis, and Anastasia. They are my strength, my silent prayer, and the love that sustains me on this demanding yet sacred artistic journey.

I also feel the blessing of my parents. My late father, Fr. Petros, blesses me from the heavenly altar, and my elderly mother's prayers accompany every step I take.

Finally, Your Eminence, my good Metropolitan and worthy shepherd of this sacred stronghold, I ask for your prayers. May God grant me and my collaborators health and blessings so that we may continue to serve the Church with works that glorify God and bring consolation and spiritual rest to the faithful souls who entrust us with such holy responsibilities.

## **Fr. Georgios' Address on the Presentation of the Sacred Iconography of Saint Thomas Cherry Hill, New Jersey**

Your Eminence,

Reverend Fathers, my beloved brothers and sisters in Christ,

Today is a day of celebration and doxology to our Thrice-Holy God for the great blessing of delivering to the devout faithful of Saint Thomas the completed work of iconography. This is a project envisioned by faithful and pious parishioners who, through the proper ecclesiastical procedures of the Parish Council and the General Assembly, and above all with the blessing of our Holy Metropolis, resolved to bring it to fruition.

As befits the history, the present, and the future of this community, they sought what was best. They did not choose painters, but true masters. They did not choose the cheapest option, but that which reflects the dignity of the house of God and a work that future generations will enjoy and say with pride in Christ, "This was accomplished by our parents and grandparents."

Therefore, they selected the distinguished master iconographer, Mr. Georgios Giariskanis, and his collaborators. Not only because he is internationally renowned, accomplished, and recognized, but because upon seeing his work they discerned that it was the most beautiful and fitting choice for Saint Thomas. I would like personally to thank all those who, through their vote in the administrative bodies of the parish, and above all through their love and generosity, contributed to the realization of this sacred project.

This work is the holy and precious inheritance you leave to your children. When they come here to worship, to bring their infants for the forty-day blessing, to baptize and marry their children, and to pray for the repose of their loved ones, they will rejoice in this beautiful and sacred iconography.

Beyond the high aesthetic beauty of the result, these holy icons also serve another very important purpose. They are a testimony, a living and missionary proclamation to every person of good will who enters our church as a visitor. During the past six months, since I was given the honor and blessing by our spiritual father, His Eminence

Metropolitan Apostolos of New Jersey, to serve the parish of Saint Thomas, many visitors from other Christian denominations have approached me when attending a sacrament here. All have spoken with admiration and awe about these holy icons. We do not know how the Grace of God works, and perhaps the beauty of these icons will lead new brothers and sisters to Orthodoxy. I must personally confess that I feel especially blessed to celebrate the Divine Services in a church so beautifully adorned.

At the first General Assembly after I assumed my duties, a parishioner raised an important point, saying that while the icons are very beautiful, it would be beneficial to understand their content and symbolism. By the Grace of God, we therefore began a weekly series of lectures every Wednesday interpreting the holy icons. We are very happy that, with these new iconographic compositions, we now have rich material to continue this catechetical journey for a long time.

Before writing this address, I tried to choose one icon to say that it was my favorite, but I could not distinguish one above the others, for each possesses a unique and unrepeatable beauty.

In closing, I would like to express my heartfelt gratitude to our spiritual father and Metropolitan of New Jersey for his spiritual guidance and leadership, his high vision for our Holy Metropolis and each of its parishes, and his paternal care for every aspect of ecclesiastical life. I thank the President of the Parish Council, Archon Anastasios Efstratiades, and all the members of the Parish Council, the Iconography Committee under the Chairman Archon George Horiates, the General Assembly, and all the members of the parish. From the bottom of my heart, I thank the donors and all who contributed in their own way to the completion of this historic project. Your financial generosity, and above all the generosity of your love and hearts, inspire us to envision even greater works for the good and progress of our parish.

Through the intercessions of the Holy Apostle Thomas and by the prayers of our holy shepherd, His Eminence Metropolitan Apostolos of New Jersey, may God bless you, your families, your children, the community of Saint Thomas, and the entire world.

**Λόγος εις την παρουσίασιν της ιεράς εικονογραφήσεως  
Αγίου Θωμά,**

**Τσέρι Χιλλ, Νέας Ιερσέης**

Σεβασμιώτατε, σεβαστοί πατέρες, αγαπητοί αδελφοί,

Σήμερα είναι ημέρα γιορτής και δοξολογίας προς τον Τρισάγιο Θεό μας για τη μεγάλη ευλογία να παραδίδεται στον ευλαβή λαό της κοινότητας του Αγίου Θωμά ολοκληρωμένο το έργο της εικονογράφησης. Ένα έργο, που οραματίστηκαν οι πιστοί και ευσεβείς ενορίτες και μέσα από τις εκκλησιαστικές διαδικασίες του Ενοριακού Συμβουλίου, της Γενικής Συνέλευσης και πάνω από όλα της ευλογίας από την Ιερά μας Μητρόπολη αποφάσισαν να υλοποιήσουν. Όπως ταιριάζει στην ιστορία, το παρόν και το μέλλον αυτής της κοινότητας αναζήτησαν ό,τι καλύτερο. Δεν διάλεξαν μπογιατζήδες αλλά μάστορες. Δεν διάλεξαν την φθηνή επιλογή αλλά αυτή που ταιριάζει στην ευπρέπεια του οίκου του Θεού και ένα έργο, που θα μπορούν να απολαμβάνουν οι επόμενες γενιές και να λένε με εν Χριστώ υπερηφάνεια «αυτό το έργο έγινε από τους γονείς και τους παππούδες μας».

Έτσι επέλεξαν τον σπουδαίο μαΐστορα της εικονογραφίας, Γεώργιο Γιαρισκάνη και τους συνεργάτες του. Όχι μόνο γιατί ήταν διεθνούς φήμης, καταξιωμένος και αναγνωρισμένος. Αλλά γιατί βλέποντας τη δουλειά του έκριναν πως είναι η πιο όμορφη και καλή επιλογή για τον Άγιο Θωμά. Και θέλω προσωπικά να ευχαριστήσω όλους όσους με την ψήφο τους στα διοικητικά όργανα της ενορίας, μα πάνω από όλα με την αγάπη τους και τη γενναιοδωρία τους συνέβαλαν σε αυτό το έργο.

Το έργο αυτό είναι η αγία και πολύτιμη κληρονομιά που αφήνετε στα παιδιά σας. Ωστε όταν έρχονται να εκκλησιάζονται, να σαραντίζουν τα βρέφη τους, να βαφτίζουν και να παντρεύουν τα παιδιά τους αλλά και να προσεύχονται για την ανάπαυση των αγαπημένων τους προσώπων, να χαίρονται την πανέμορφη ιερή εικονογράφηση.

Όμως, εκτός από την υψηλή αισθητική του αποτελέσματος υπάρχει και μία ακόμα πολύ σημαντική λειτουργία αυτών των εικόνων. Είναι μία μαρτυρία, ένας λόγος ζωντανός και ιεραποστολικός προς κάθε άνθρωπο καλής προαίρεσης που βρίσκεται στην εκκλησία μας ως επισκέπτης. Τους τελευταίους έξι μήνες, που έχω την τιμή και ευλογία από τον πνευματικό μας πατέρα, Σεβασμιώτατο Μητροπολίτη Νέας Ιερσέης, κύριο Απόστολο, να διακονώ την ενορία του Αγίου Θωμά, με πλησίασαν αρκετές δεκάδες

επισκεπτών, οι οποίοι ανήκουν σε άλλα χριστιανικά δόγματα και βρέθηκαν εδώ για την τέλεση κάποιου μυστηρίου, και όλοι μίλησαν με ενθουσιασμό και δέος για αυτές τις εικόνες. Δεν γνωρίζουμε πως ενεργεί η Χάρις του Θεού και ενδεχομένως η ομορφιά αυτών των εικόνων να φέρει νέους αδελφούς μας στην Ορθοδοξία. Όπως και εγώ προσωπικά οφείλω να ομολογήσω ότι αισθάνομαι ιδιαίτερα ευλογημένος να ιερουργώ σε έναν ναό τόσο όμορφα ζωγραφισμένο.

Κατά την πρώτη Γενική Συνέλευση μετά την ανάληψη των καθηκόντων μου μία ενορίτισσα έθεσε ένα ζήτημα λέγοντας ότι οι εικόνες είναι πολύ όμορφες αλλά θα ήταν καλό να γνωρίζουμε το περιεχόμενο και τους συμβολισμούς τους. Έτσι ξεκινήσαμε με τη Χάρι του Θεού κάθε Τετάρτη μία σειρά διαλέξεων ερμηνεύοντας τις ιερές εικόνες και είμαστε πολύ χαρούμενοι, που πλέον με τις νέες εικονογραφικές συνθέσεις έχουμε υλικό, για να συνεχίσουμε για πολύ καιρό ακόμα.

Πριν γράψω την ομιλία αυτή προσπάθησα να επιλέξω μία εικόνα, για να πω ότι μου άρεσε περισσότερο από όλες αλλά δεν μπόρεσα να ξεχωρίσω καμία, καθώς η καθεμία έχει μοναδική και ανεπανάληπτη ομορφιά.

Κλείνοντας, θα ήθελα να ευχαριστήσω με τη σειρά μου τον πνευματικό μας πατέρα και Μητροπολίτη μας για την πνευματική καθοδήγηση και ηγεσία, τους υψηλούς οραματισμούς του για την Ιερά Μητρόπολη και κάθε ενορία και την πατρική φροντίδα για κάθε θέμα της εκκλησιαστικής ζωής. Τον Πρόεδρο του Ενοριακού Συμβουλίου, Αρχοντα Αναστάσιο Ευστρατιάδη, και όλα τα μέλη του Συμβουλίου, την επιτροπή εικονογράφησης υπό τον Αρχοντα Γιώργο Χωριάτη, τη Γενική Συνέλευση και όλα τα μέλη της ενορίας. Ευχαριστώ μέσα από την καρδιά μου τους δωρητές και όλους όσους συνέβαλαν με τον δικό τους τρόπο στην ολοκλήρωση αυτού του ιστορικού έργου. Η οικονομική σας γενναιοδωρία, μα πάνω από όλα η γενναιοδωρία της αγάπης και της καρδιάς σας, μας εμπνέουν να οραματιστούμε και άλλα έργα για το καλό και την πρόοδο της ενορίας.

## **Anastasios Efstratiades' Address at the Official Presentation of the Completed Iconography of St. Thomas Greek Orthodox Church, Cherry Hill, NJ**

Your Eminence Metropolitan Apostolos of New Jersey,

Rev. Protopresbyter Georgios,

Reverend clergy,

Archons of the Ecumenical Patriarchate,

Members of the Parish Council,

President and Members of the St. Thomas Philothos,

Dear Fellow Parishioners and Friends of Saint Thomas,

Today is a great day in the history of this parish. After three years of work, the iconography of the main Church has been completed.

In times like this we first must pay tribute to those who came before us and built this house of God, which we were given the blessed opportunity to adorn.

The Hellenic Community of this area was organized in the neighboring city of Camden, New Jersey since the 1920s, approximately 100 years ago. First, they were crossing the river and attending services at St. George Cathedral in Philadelphia. Later they were given permission to celebrate the Liturgy at St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Camden. Finally, in 1967, 59 years ago, they purchased this property and built this Church, which was dedicated to Saint Thomas the Apostle. Those early founders of this Church, the “κτίτορες”, as we refer to them in Greek were not rich. They were working families who made a small wage every week. However, they all signed the mortgage personally, and from their weekly salary they

would put away a few dollars to make the mortgage payment for their home, St. Thomas.

Those faithful individuals and families we commemorate today.

The original Church was a simple building with a flat roof. However, the foresight of our predecessors commissioned the icons of the Eortologio in the 1970s, which you see in the surrounding walls.

In 2017, on the 50th anniversary of the opening of the Church, the community overwhelmingly decided to complete the Church building and add architectural elements to make this Church conforming to Byzantine tradition. During the consecutive presidencies of George Horiates, Stathis Karadonis and Dimitri Rozanitis, and the guidance of the then Proistameno Very Rev. Archimandrite Christoforos Oikonomidis, the renovation plan was conceived and the first stage of the construction, the exonarthex was completed (that is the area in the front of the Church with the columns and the portico). The entrance was adorned with a mosaic of Christ with Panagia on the one side and St. Thomas on the other. In 2018 we finalized the plans for the Dome, the Belltower and the covering the exterior walls with stone. God through the intercession of St. Thomas gave me the strength to serve as president of the Parish Council in 2019 and complete this work with the support and guidance of our Proistameno Father Christoforos, the invaluable assistance of the building committee chair, George Horiates and the support of all the parishioners.

As soon as we completed the construction we set our eyes to the iconography. Then, COVID came in our midst and slowed down our plans.

However, in 2023, under the presidency of George Horiates and the guidance of our new proistameno the Very Rev. Archmandrite Avgoustinos Psomas, we started planning again the iconography project. In 2023 with the Blessing of His Eminence Metropolitan Apostolos, we proceeded with engaging Mr. Georgios Giariskanis, a renowned iconographer from Greece to proceed with the iconography. In.



2024, George Horiates became chair of the iconography committee and I succeeded him as Parish Council President. George did an amazing job fundraising for this wonderful project. The first and largest donor was the couple of George and the late Zoe Kousoulis who pledged the icon of Pantokrator in memory of their daughter the beloved Danielle. Zoe fell asleep in the Lord last Sunday as she was getting ready to come to Church and chant in the choir. May her memory be eternal.

Mr. Giariskanis' reputation is worldwide. Having studied in the Athoniada School of Iconography, the most renowned institution for byzantine iconography, located in Mty. Athos (Agion Oros), he has beautified churches in Greece, Germany and the United States. He sits on the committee of the Church of Greece that approves the iconography of every Church building. Mr. Giariskanis was faced with an enormous task. An octagonal Church with a large ceiling has a tremendous amount of work.

He did it methodically:

- First he completed the Pantokrator, surrounded by the angels and then the prophets. At the lower part he put the Just of the old Testament. All that was done in accordance with the Church's theological order. In the Orthodox Church, our architecture, our painting, our music they are not art, they are prayer. And prayer is performed not just by words, but also by the actions of the architect, the iconographer, the chanter.

- The second phase of Mr. Giariskani's work was the icons of more than 60 saints in the lower walls of the Church. This is probably the largest synaxis of Saints in the United States.

- Then came the last phase, which was the painting of scenes from the New testament in the ceiling and the restoration of the original icons surrounding the Church from the 1070s.

- This last phase included the most unique work the panel in the back of the Church dedicated to the life of St. Thomas. This original work does not exist anywhere and our iconographer. Mr. Giariskanis had to create the scenes by studying the

scriptures and holy tradition the same way the early Christian iconographers did. The scenes on the panel depict, first on the right the baptism of a prince in India, in the center Thomas teaching the people of India and on the left the martyrdom of the Saint. This unique work is going to remain for the ages.

The project was not without challenges. We had many obstacles along the way. However, I want to thank you His Eminence Metropolitan Apostolos of New Jersey for his continuing support, advice and encouragement from the beginning of this project, so that this Orthodox community keep the faith, continue the fight and reach the end of the road today.

I want to thank the person who did all the fundraising for the project, George Horiates. Without his tireless efforts we would not have been able to fund this project.

Also, I am grateful to the Parish Council, the Philotohos, the Church ministries, the Saint Thomas office staff, and so many friends of St. Thomas who contributed in time, talent and treasure to make our iconography a success.

Since I was given the blessing to preside over the construction and the iconography work, something that I was not worthy spiritually to handle, I want to thank the Proistamenoï who gave me spiritual guidance in the process, Father Christoforos, Father Avgoustinos and Father Georgios. Although Father Georgios came at the end of this process he has proven to be a very spiritual person and a good administrator, whose wise advice has been of great help to us.

One special thank you goes to our patron and protector, St. Thomas: A young man who followed Jesus Christ and has often been forgotten for all he did. We know that Saint Thomas watched over us to see this project to its completion, and I am sure he is happy to see us honor him in such a special way.

At the end and above all let us give Glory to God for allowing us to see this beautiful prayer to Him completed through the intercessions of His Holy Mother the Theotokos, His Apostle Thomas and all the Saints that surround us.

## SAINT THOMAS MEDAL OF FAITH GALA

On Friday, April 17, 2026, Saint Thomas Greek Orthodox Church will celebrate years of love, faith, dedication, and progress at Lucien's Manor.

The Gala will honor **George and the late Zoe Kousoulis**, who have dedicated their time, talent, and treasure over the years—first as founders and later as benefactors of Saint Thomas Church. They helped finance the renovation of the Cultural Center and humbly allowed the renaming of the Cultural Center to the Daniele Kousoulis Hellenic Cultural Center in honor of their daughter, who tragically lost her life in the events of

September 11, 2001, in the terrorist attack on the World Trade Center in New York City. George and Zoe opened the doors to the newly renovated façade, leading to the restoration of the church itself, and provided a substantial contribution to that effort, including the donation of the Pantocrator in the new dome.



This year's Gala will be bittersweet, as our beloved Zoe Kousoulis passed away on February 15, 2026. She will always be remembered for her warmth, dedication, and tireless service to our church community. Zoe was a longtime member of the Saint Thomas Choir, the St. Irene Philoptochos Society, and the Daughters of Penelope. She worked tirelessly for the annual Agora Festival, and alongside her many commitments to the church, she supported George in his business and raised a loving and beautiful family.

The Parish Council determined the Medal of Faith will be awarded to a parishioner who has shown profound love, faith and dedication to the Orthodox faith and our Saint Thomas parish and community. It is a way to honor those who have gone beyond the normal bounds for the life of our parish.

The evening will feature a **special musical tribute** in honor of the Kousoulis family, presenting a rich and immersive program rooted in the sacred and cultural traditions of Hellenism. This commemorative program will be offered by the School of Byzantine Music of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America Choir, the Saint Thomas Choir, and The Politico Ensemble. Blending the solemn beauty of Byzantine hymnology with the vibrant spirit of traditional Greek and Asia Minor folk music, the program will reflect the breadth of Hellenic musical heritage—from Constantinople and the islands to the mainland and beyond—celebrating both faith and culture in a unified artistic expression.

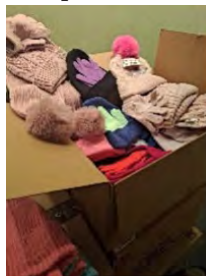


# SAINT IRENE PHILOPTOCHOS

There were enough beanies and gloves for all the kids in both schools. The Martha F. Wilson Early Childhood Development Center students received most of the scarves and the items for the H.B. Wilson School students were organized in boxes by class based on the numbers provided.



Martha F. Wilson Early Childhood Development Preschool and Kindergarten has 376 students and the H.B. Wilson Elementary School - Kindergarten to 8th grade has 400 students. 776 students received beanies and gloves that were age appropriate. Additionally the Early Childhood Development Center kids also received 173 scarves. Our parishioners generously provided beanies, scarves, gloves for 230 stu-





dents. St. Irene Philoptochos provided 548 students with beanies, scarves, hats and also provided each school with \$150 worth of supplies, such as Lysol wipes, bottles of hand sanitizer, tissue boxes, and fragrance-free wipes. These supplies were suggested by the two teachers to help the kids get through winter colds, and to help prevent the spread of colds and flu.

On Tuesday, December 16, we gathered to support our neighbors and make casseroles, a small act of kindness to feed the hungry and warm their hearts. No one should go hungry. With the continuous assistance of the Kali Parea and Parish Council members, we made 110 that included chicken in red sauce, penne pasta, vegetables and cheese. These casseroles help feed the homeless men who shelter or visit St. John's Hospice and rely on the goodness of others for their food, clothing and prayers. SJH goes through 80 casseroles each day to serve over 250 individuals. One casserole provides a hot meal to 6-8 members of our community.

Again, on Friday, January 23, we were able to prepare 97 casseroles. Preparation started Friday morning when some gentlemen of Kali Parea/Maturity Club and Parish Council got together to prepare the chicken, sauce, vegetables and pasta. 97 casseroles means that 776 meals will be served at St. John's Hospice.

Did you know that between 2023 and 2024, homelessness increased by 9.8 percent in Philadelphia, and the number of people who were unsheltered increased by 38.2 percent? Saint John's Hospice provides emergency shelter for up to 30 individuals every night of the year.

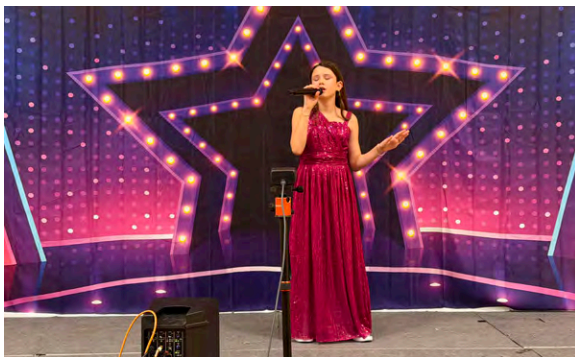

## “THE ST. THOMAS “KALI PAREA” ENJOYS ITS 19th YEAR!”



The “Good Company” is a free-wheeling get-together of Greek-American men, mainly retirees, that meet once a week “cafe-style” to drink their coffee, and to share their pleasant company and discuss issues of interest. The language is Greek. Everyone is welcome, every Wednesday at 10am-12noon, especially new members, that are received with great pleasure! The “Kali Parea” (Καλή Παρέα) started 19 years ago in November, with three friends: Chris Vranas of Mt. Laurel, George Kousoulis of Haddonfield, and Chris Sivas of Cherry Hill, meeting for coffee at the Moorestown Mall.

They soon invited and attracted many more, and it was not long afterward that they moved their

“kafeneio” to a small room in the basement of St. Thomas Greek Orthodox Church at Cherry Hill, NJ. This get-together became so popular that the original meeting room was not large enough, so it was moved to its present location, at the St. Irene Hall of the same basement. At this unique social gathering, there thrives a culture of sharing historical perspectives, humorous jokes, educational tidbits, fond memories of Greece, and the experiences of becoming Greek-Americans.

Over the intervening years, this unique group has thrived, with the current number being 44 members. Each weekly gathering often exceeds 30 people, especially through the Fall through



Spring, when many return from their annual visit to “The Homeland, Greece.” Their roots come from throughout Greece, including the Ionian and Aegean islands, the mainland North and South, and the Peloponnese.

Most were born in Greece, and came to America as young men, seeking their fortune in the “New World,” met the difficult challenges of young immigrants, and became successful businessmen or professionals, family men, and community leaders. They love their mother country, but also share a deep affection for their second “Patrida,” the USA.

As is to be expected, as most members are of retirement age, over the passing years quite a number have been called to join their maker, and thus over 20 of the original group are fondly remembered. We are happy to have two of the founders, George and Chris, with us. Although the “Kali Pareia” remains – on purpose – unofficial, so as to maintain its loose, free-wheeling “cafeneio style” existence, it has in

fact become a recognized and respected part of the Greek community. It is always a pleasure to be joined, at the Wednesday meetings, with St. Thomas' recently welcomed Priest, Fr. Georgios Oikonomou, who enjoys the company and contributes to the discussions.

Several of its members, with experience in restaurants, are part of the core of the volunteers that man the kitchen and/or serving at various community functions, including the annual “Agora” (Greek Food Festival,) the monthly Maturity Club's luncheons, and supporting and being members of other social organizations of the St. Thomas Church. The “Kali Pareia” supports the Church itself, as well as to the various philanthropic societies such as the Philoptochos, and others. Together with the Maturity Club, the “Kali Pareia” co-sponsored one of the Saints of the recently completed iconography project of St. Thomas Church at Cherry Hill.
